

# CoC Scoring (Comparing 2021 vs 2022 and Unsheltered/Rural Point Allocation)



This document highlights the changes from the 2021 Continuum of Care (CoC) Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) scoring to the 2022 CoC NOFO scoring. It also compares the 2022 CoC Competition scoring to the 2022 Unsheltered and Rural Homelessness NOFO that was released in June 2022.
