Title: 4.1. Rank & Review CoC Competition and Project Types Overview

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Each year, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) makes resources available to communities through a national competition for its Continuum of Care (CoC) Homeless Assistance Programs. Community Alliance for the Homeless, Inc. (CAFTH) is the lead agency for Memphis/Shelby County CoC. CAFTH is responsible for preparing a consolidated application to submit to HUD for all Memphis/Shelby County eligible projects. The community application for funding is done under the guiding framework of the federal HEARTH Act and related regulations and directives from HUD. There are 3 primary components to the application:

- 1) community-wide performance;
- 2) renewal grants; and
- 3) new projects (pending the availability of funding & community performance)

For CoC Planning funds and Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) funds, the CoC Collaborative Applicant is the only entity allowed to submit applications for those funds.

Agencies are able to apply for renewal grants and new project funds through the following applications found in the FY 2023 CoC Competition Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO):

- 1) New Projects for DV Bonus (Section III.B.4.b.4)
- 2) New Projects Created Through Reallocation or CoC Bonus Projects (Section III.B.4.b.3)
- 3) Replacement YHDP Project (Section III.B.4.b.5)
- 4) Special YHDP Activities (Section III.B.4.b.6)
- 5) Transition Grants (Section III.B.2.cc)
- 6) Expansion Project (Section III.B.4.b.7)
- 7) Consolidation Project (Section III.B.4.b.8)
- 8) Renewal Projects (Section III.B.3.c)
- 9) Renewal Grants Per Unit Cost (Section III.B.4.b.9)
